**June 6 - June 10**

## Music Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

Campers will learn how to play guitar chords, sing, write songs and will visit performance venues in Louisville. Beginners are welcome and instruments are provided.

## Sport and Fitness Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

Campers will travel to local athletic facilities, participate in fun sport and fitness activities, learn about nutrition, and making the right choices for a healthy lifestyle!

## Canoe Day Camp

**Ages 11 - 17**

Participants will learn how to safely canoe on local lakes and streams. Mandatory safety gear will be provided. Water levels permitting, there will be a paddle trip on Indiana's Blue River. CAMPERS MUST BE ABLE TO SWIM.

## Expressions of ME Day Camp

**Ages 12 - 16**

Campers will study different styles of poetry, play games, practice writing, travel to parks, museums, libraries and other sites to get inspiration for their own work! The week will end with a public performance of each campers writing.

## Canoe Travel Camp

**Ages 12 - 16 (Invitation Only)**

Graduates of our canoeing program will put their skills to the test on Missouri's Current River. This 50-mile trip will give campers the opportunity to have a primitive camping experience with trained and experienced guides.

## Musical Ministries Day Camp

**(Invitation Only)**

This "mission trip" camp will use the talents of staff and campers to bring musical performances to some local shelters and other organizations.

## Sugar and Spice Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

Girls and female staff will explore how to become a confident and informed young woman. Classes may include grooming, shopping on a budget at local malls, jewelry making, swimming, tea parties and more!

## Living History: Exploring the Civil War

**Ages 9 - 13**

Campers will step back in time to gain a better understanding the Civil War through hands on activities such as crafts and cooking. Campers will be taught skills by "real" Civil War soldiers. Camp will end with an overnight trip (June 18-19th) to a Civil War Reenactment, where campers will dress up, camp in period tents, watch the Battle of Bull Run, and present their knowledge to guests!

## Measure of a Man Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

This is a "rite of passage" camp to help young boys learn skills they will need as men. With fun, theme-based activities such as: cooking, handyman skills, chivalry, fitness, and outdoor "survival" skills. The week will culminate in an overnight camping experience.

## Horse Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

The Cabbage Patch and the Louisville Equestrian Center are working together this summer to create an all-new horse camp experience! Campers will learn basic horsemanship skills such as riding and grooming, as well as participate in games and crafts of a "horsey" nature.

## Golf and Tennis Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

A beginning golf & tennis camp. Players will learn basic tennis rules and receive instruction from a golfing professional, visit miniature golf courses, hit balls at driving ranges and play a real game of golf and tennis.

## Bike Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

This is a beginning bike course designed to teach youth how to ride safely, make minor bike repairs, plan a bike route, and ride Louisville's ever-expanding bike trails. Campers will visit local sites of interest and go swimming. NO BIKE NEEDED TO REGISTER.

## Science to DO!

**Ages 9 - 11**

Campers will explore the principles of science and engage in exciting hands on experiments! Campers will visit local museums, laboratories and universities, plus design and execute their own experiments for a "science fair" at the end of the week.

## Art Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

Staff will develop campers' creativity through visual art projects such as printmaking, sculpture, drawing and painting. Campers will also visit local art galleries and studios for inspiration. No Art Experience Required.

## Leadership Development Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

Effective leadership requires one to possess certain values and skills. In Leadership Development, campers will explore those values as well as exercise them in various community service and leadership activities.

## Smoky Mountains Travel Camp

**Ages 12 - 16 (Invitation Only)**

Campers will travel to Great Smoky Mountains National Park to camp, visit area attractions and go white water rafting.

## Safari Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

Campers will travel to zoos and local nature centers, participate in outdoor games and learning about local wildlife and their needs.

## Computer Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

Campers will improve their computer skills while participating in field trips and classes in our computer lab. They will practice keyboarding skills and learn how to use several computer programs both for fun and to enhance their academic potential.

## Football Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 13**

This beginning NON-contact football camp will teach campers the fundamentals and rules of the game and what they can do to prepare to play football.

## Discover Louisville Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

Campers will visit many Louisville attractions including: The Science Center, Frazier History Museum, the Louisville Slugger factory and the Muhammad Ali Center.

## Wilderness Women Travel Day Camp

**Girls Only Ages 9 - 16**

Led by our female staff, this camp will focus on outdoor skills such as setting up a tent, building a fire, caving, fishing, horseback riding and outdoor cooking....just for the girls!

## Vacation Bible School

**Ages 8 - 12**

Campers will experience the love of the Lord through spiritual activities, games, and crafts. Campers will swim at Jeffersonville Aquatic Center in the afternoons.

## Photography Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

Using digital photography, campers will learn to take nature pictures, action shots, portraits, and still life images. We will visit local galleries, learn Photoshop and hand-coloring techniques. Cameras will be provided.

## Spring Hill Resident Camp

**Entering grades 4-6 (Invitation Only)**

Selected campers will be invited to participate in a Christian resident camp located in Seymour, Indiana. Activities may include: swimming in a guarded lake, Bible study, sports, horseback riding, singing and acting in campfire skits, climbing walls and X-Games.

## Travel Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

Campers will travel each day to visit fun destinations in the Kentuckiana region, such as Newport Aquarium, Atlantis Water Park and Marengo Cave.

## Blue Apple Players Theater Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

This entry level theater camp will be led by the Blue Apple Players, a local theater group whose mission is to bring theater to youth. Campers will perform on the last day of camp for family and friends.

## Washington D.C. Bike Travel Camp

**Ages 12 - 17 (Invitation Only)**

Bikers will travel to Virginia and ride 100+ miles on the C & O Canal bike trail. Campers will visit Washington, D.C. and see several museums at the Nation's Capitol. Campers will leave on July 18th and return July 23rd. Youth must be physically fit and mature.

## Ju-Ju the Clown Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 12**

In memory of Ju-Ju the Clown, various Louisville clowns will teach campers about costumes, makeup, skits, magic tricks and making balloon animals. Campers will play games, go swimming and perform for friends and family.

## Soccer Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

This is a beginning soccer camp. Staff from The Cabbage Patch and the Americana Community Center will teach passing, heading, shooting, dribbling and game rules. The head instructor is a former college player and coach at Collegiate School.

## Performing Arts Day Camp

**Ages 9 - 16**

Lights! Camera! Action! Campers will experience various aspects of theater including: lighting, set & costume design, and, of course, acting! All week campers will work towards a final Friday performance.

## Lake Superior Travel Camp

**Ages 12 - 17 (Invitation Only)**

Campers will backpack at the Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore along the Lake Superior shoreline. Activities include backpacking, hiking, camping, and relaxation.

## Wilderness Men Travel Day Camp

**Boys Only Ages 9 - 16**

This camp will travel to a different location each day such as Wyandotte Woods and the Blue River. Campers will learn various outdoor skills such as setting up a tent, building a fire, and outdoor cooking.
