West End School Partnership: A New Chapter of Growth at The Cabbage Patch

Every day at The Patch, we see our members learning, growing, and thriving in a space designed to nurture their development. Recently, we had the opportunity to expand our mission through a partnership with West End School, a private independent school serving boys in grades K–8 in Louisville's West End.

This partnership, initiated through our connection with a cherished friend of The Patch, Walt Kunau, grew out of the school's desire to extend their students' learning beyond the classroom. They recognized The Patch's excellence in after school programming and saw an opportunity for their students to further develop academically, socially, and emotionally.

Dr. Gregory E. Ross, President - Head of School at West End School, shared, "Partnering with an organization that wraps its arms around a young person and sees them through to becoming successful adults mirrors our goals and passions. Our students who are new to The Cabbage Patch are excited about this extension of their learning and the many opportunities it provides."

At West End School, students recite a powerful daily credo instilling values of dedication and responsibility. One line declares, "I understand with each privilege comes responsibility... it is my choice to learn or not to learn, but I must be willing to accept the consequences of that choice." These principles perfectly align with The Patch's mission to build self-reliance and self-confidence in the young people we serve.

Together, we are creating a stronger foundation for these students to grow into their full potential.



Empowering Exploring: Adventure and Safety at The Patch!

This summer, Recreation and Youth Development Managers Ryan Lovelace and Liliara Pappaterra led 12 Cabbage Patch kids on an unforgettable Travel Camp adventure in the Great Smoky Mountains. Alongside Travel Camp, The Patch hosted several other outdoor adventure camps, making summer an exciting season for exploration and growth. But our commitment to outdoor programs doesn't stop when summer ends—these activities are woven into the fabric of what we do, continuing to enrich young lives throughout the school year.

These adventures are grounded in a commitment to safety, thanks to our staff's exceptional training. Ryan and Liliara hold Wilderness First Responder (WFR) certifications, a demanding 90-hour course that prepares them to address medical situations in remote settings. This expertise allows Patch kids to explore confidently in a safe and supportive environment.

In November, Ryan and Liliara renewed their WFR certifications at the Nantahala Outdoor Center, further strengthening their skills. Reflecting on this training, Lili shared, "These essential skills are used daily at The Patch, from handling minor scrapes to managing serious situations. Our training ensures the safest environment for our kids to grow and thrive."



This unparalleled training empowers our staff and opens doors to life-changing opportunities for our youth. Looking ahead, this foundation of safety and preparedness allows us to expand our current offerings—introducing more outdoor adventures during spring break, summer camps, and beyond.

Nourishing Success: Dare to Care Partnership

Our partnership with Dare to Care Food Bank is transforming the lives of youth at The Patch. Since launching our evening meal program in September, every child now receives a balanced dinner. This consistency has led to a noticeable decline in behavior issues, showing the profound impact of nourishment.



Due to high demand, we have already increased the number of meals provided. This program is about more than food; it builds a foundation for success, helping kids focus, thrive, and approach each day even more ready to achieve success.

On a recent evening, Aveeon, one of our teen leaders, helped serve meals, embodying the community spirit of The Patch. Teen leaders like him not only assist but also mentor younger kids, as Aveeon says, guiding them "on the right path."

We are deeply grateful to Dare to Care for their partnership. Thanks to their support and leaders like Aveeon, Patch kids are thriving—one meal at a time.

Faith in Action: The Cana Sunday School Class' Enduring Witness

For many years, the Cana Sunday School Class at Christ Church United Methodist has been a steadfast partner of The Cabbage Patch, faithfully answering God's call to serve. This dedicated group provides crucial support to Patch families during Thanksgiving, ensuring they can celebrate the holiday with a full meal.

Their involvement began with Walt Kunau, a former Cabbage Patch Board Member and Cana Class member, who



inspired the class to support Patch families by providing Thanksgiving meals. This act of service allows Patch families, who often face financial instability, to enjoy a special holiday meal while easing their financial burden.

The class has perfected this ministry over the years. Each fall, they fundraise in October, shop for groceries in early November, and gather on the Sunday before Thanksgiving to assemble the meals. During this meeting, members work efficiently in two assembly lines, packing bags filled with all the items for a Thanksgiving meal. A quality control lead ensures nothing is missed.

Once the bags are ready, they are delivered to The Patch, where some families personally thank the class for their generosity.

This year, the Cana Class provided an impressive 85 meals! Yet, they remain humble, focusing on meeting needs rather than seeking recognition. As Walt said, the class is full of "good people in our church that do good things very quietly."

"We're so grateful for their support," shared Doug Holm, Family Development Manager at The Patch. "The Cana Sunday School Class embodies what it means to be a good neighbor, and their kindness inspires us all."

Volunteers like the Cana Class are a blessing, and for them we are very thankful!
